Who we are and what we do:

The West Coast Seafood Processors Association (WCSPA) was founded in 1993 by a group of seafood processors who realized that no other organization existed exclusively to deal with the problems and challenges facing shore-based seafood processors in Washington, Oregon and California. WCSPA has since grown to represent most major, and many minor, shore-based processors. WCSPA represents the interests of the West Coast seafood processing industry in the California, Oregon and Washington legislatures and with the fish and wildlife departments of those states. We deal with the Pacific Fishery Management Council, the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission, the National Marine Fisheries Service, state legislatures and the U.S. Congress. We serve as a central information source for our members, providing information on regulations and on the availability of goods and services. Our staff serves on several Council and state committees and is active in international discussions on trans-boundary species.

WCSPA was the first seafood industry group in the U.S. to endorse the United States Fishing Industry Principles for Responsible Fisheries. By signing these principles, WCSPA has made a commitment to promote good science, sustainable fishing practices, habitat conservation, production and sale of safe products, and compliance with conservation laws and regulations. WCSPA and its members have contributed to data collection projects looking at bycatch and landings, fought for more funding for scientific research and worked with scientists to improve stock assessments. With your help, we will continue these efforts and do even more to ensure sustainable ocean resources.
